How you can support our work

Helping the community can involve time, effort and money, and we know that not everyone is able to contribute in equal measure. So there are now three ways in which you can support Rotary:

1) By joining our club as a full member

At a cost of £10.00 per month, this gives access to the complete range of club activities, both charitable and social, but does require a certain amount of regular commitment.

2) By joining our club as an associate member

Free of charge for the first six months; thereafter a donation of a minimum of £5.00 per month. Associate members can take part in as many club events and activities as they wish but have no say in decision-making and are ineligible to vote.

3) By supporting us with a regular or one-off gift

100% of donations go to support our charitable work; not a penny is used in administration.

Whether it's a tsunami in the Indian Ocean, an earthquake in Haiti or a children's home in

South Africa, Rotary is always there to offer practical help.

In 1985 the Rotary movement made a commitment to help eradicate polio from the world. Since then more than two billion children have been immunised, new cases reduced from 350,000 to around 500 annually and

the wild form of the disease eliminated from all but four countries.

Rotary has already raised \$1.2 billion for eradication and is committed to a further \$200 million by the end of 2012 to fund the final push which will rid the world of this crippling scourge.
